Whyville has worked with a wide range of partners to influence and engage tweens including Dell, Scion (Toyota), The Getty Museum, the Field Museum, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Disney. Dr. Bower is also a computational neurobiologist at the Research Imaging Institute of the University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio (bower-lab.org) and has served on education and technology advisory committees for the National Academy of Sciences, the National Science Foundation, the Ford Foundation, and the National Institutes of Health.
