The Engineering Kids© Storybook series is the only series of illustrated children's books that is written by professional engineers and targets very young children when they are the impressionable ages of 5 to 8 years old.

Their efforts have been applauded by the American Society of Civil Engineers and the National Academy of Engineering. "Rocks, Jeans, and Busy Machines" was named a Finalist in the 2009 Next Generation Indie Book Awards contest.

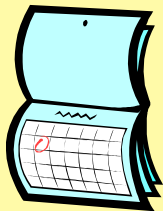
